During their time there, the band shared their faith on the streets while playing music and giving away bibles and hundreds of CD’s, all in hopes of the bringing the message of their faith to the people in the area.

During their stay, Esterlyn’s Luke Caldwell shared this post on the band’s website, “It has definitely been stretching my comfort zone to just set up in the piazzas and start singing. We have been amazed to be able to share and pray with prostitutes and even give them bibles. It amazes me that we as Christians have the answers to the fulfillment so many people are searching for...we pray God continues to gives us boldness as we go out each day and night seeking to serve and save those who are lost in their sin. God really offers us freedom.” Now that they are back in the U.S., based from the experience of this the band is on fire more than ever to minister to those who are hurting.

While back in the states, Esterlyn is getting some serious radio airplay. The band’s version of the Hillsong United song “Freedom is Here” is currently hitting the CHR airwaves, with 13 weeks of charting and is also spinning on Air1.
